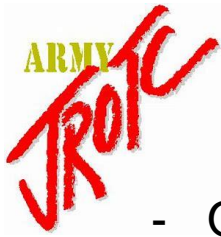

History of the Wildcat Battalion



- Organized in school year 2018-19 as Army NDCC
- Opening Enrollment of 139 cadets that year
- At this time, 98 cadets
- Currently have one cadets enlisted in the Texas Army National Guard
- Scheduled to become JROTC on 1 March 2019
- Program will undergo a JROTC Program Accreditation 2021

NDCC – Fully funded by the school district

JROTC- Army pays for uniforms, logistics, training and 50% of Instructor salaries
